#### STUDENT ADVISED FUND AWARDS GRANT TO DISNEY WAY WORKSHOP

Leadership the Disney Way Workshop allowed Seeger students to learn effective communication, critical thinking, and the art of innovation as well as the belief that everyone can be a leader. Several leadership styles were discussed including the difference between being an autocratic leader versus a democratic leader. The real-world application of these principles were experienced through participation in various problem-solving scenarios. Students also learned about the importance of Disney's 5 Keys of Excellence—principles that guide Disney Cast Members in everything they do and Disney's 3 Keys Concepts Strategy. The Student Advised fund gave an \$800 grant to help pay for one of the leadership activities while the students were on the trip.
