Hello Foundation Friends.



I can't believe this is the last e-newsletter of 2024. I have some exciting news to share, but will put it at the end of my letter! This has been a year to remember! There is much to celebrate and be proud of. We awarded a record amount of grant dollars, received grants ourselves, and helped others receive grants. At the beginning of the year, we were awarded a \$50,000 Planning grant for Lilly GIFT VIII for Warren County and a \$50,000 Planning Grant for Lilly GIFT VIII for a regional collaboration between Warren, Fountain, and Vermillion counties. I will put more about these in the Did You Know? section at the bottom of the e-newsletter. We opened a coffee shop with the help of volunteers giving over 1,000 hours of their time. We applied for and made the finals of a competitive GIFT VIII Grant. We met the match on the unrestricted part of Lilly GIFT VIII and received \$675,000 in match (we are still about \$40,000 short on meeting the 1:1 match for the operating endowment but we have 2025 to complete this). We applauded Warren County LEDO as they made the Final Four in the Stellar Pathways program through OCRA. We partnered with CAPWI and other to successfully implement a \$125,000 grant from the Clinton Foundation for the Too Small to Fail Early Literacy Program. Then, just this week, we learned that we are one of 30 Community Foundations from around the state to receive a competitive GIFT VIII Grant.!! There were 90 original submissions. This work started in January with the concept paper due in April. In the summer, we learned that we made the finals, and the final grant application was submitted in early September. This week we found out that our regional proposal for the Wabash River Blueway in Warren, Fountain, and Vermillion counties received a \$3 million dollar grant!!!!! Work will start right away. FELLURE FAMILY LEGACY FUND AWARDS GRANT TO A BETTER WAY FOOD CO OP

The Foundation awarded \$239 to the Seeger Guidance Department to put towards College and Career Readiness activities. The guidance department hosts a few different events throughout the year to help students prepare for the next steps after high school.



LEARNING CENTER RECEIVES GRANT FROM THE FOUNTAIN-WARREN VFW POST #3318 MEN'S AUXILIARY FUND

Lisa Cruea, director of the Learning Center accepted the check from the Fountain-Warren VFW Post #3318 Men's Auxiliary Fund at the Foundation. Many courses require specific equipment; this scholarship fund payout will go towards these supplies for the Adult Education program.





COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM RECEIVES GRANT FOR HEAD START SAFETY KITS

In a previous newsletter we announced that a grant was awarded to the Community Action Program for safety kits. Toni McGowen, the director of CAPWI Head Start accepted the grant check for \$750 this month. We are happy to be able to provide this grant for these kits!



COMMUNITY GRANT AWARDED TO WILLIAMSPORT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The Foundation awarded all three elementary schools a grant for items including clothes and personal hygiene items for the nurse's office to have available for students. A \$1,500 grant was awarded to Williamsport Elementary School to put towards the items they put in their grant submission!





BILLINGS-BELL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FUND GRANTS \$4,182 TO PINE VILLAGE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Foundation is pleased to award this grant to help pay for the expenses associated with the Emergency Medical Responder Certification Course. Over 20 people completed the course and passed the class. The grant went towards instructional materials and consumable training aids. The course was hosted by the Pine Village Volunteer Fire Department and took place at Ascension St. Vincent. Individuals from all fire departments in Warren County were represented.



MARGE CLARK EDUCATION FUND AWARDS GRANT TO THE WARREN COUNTY POOL

Earlier in the year the Marge Clark Education Fund awarded a large grant to the Young Explorers for a drone program leaving \$403 remaining for this year's payout. With the additional money that was remaining, the foundation made a grant from the Marge Clark Fund to go towards the new Warren County swimming pool.

This week, the Lt. Governors office announced the winners of Stellar Pathways. The winners were Wabash County and Dearborn County. Warren, Fountain, and Vermillion counties worked with Kimley-Horn to develop a Wabash River Blueway Master Plan. The long-term goals are to create a 74-mile Blueway along the Wabash River going through all of Warren, Fountain, and Vermillion counties. We also want to work towards more launches on Big Pine Creek and the Vermillion River.

Anyone interested in enrolling will need to do so during this period. Anyone currently with a Marketplace plan will also need to re-enroll for the 2025 plan year!



Free screenings for uninsured and under insured women in Warren County


